In Loving Memory

Honoring Volunteers Who Helped Shape Our Festival

The Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival has always been powered by volunteers. It is sustained by the hands and hearts of those who give their time, talents, and love to something greater than themselves. This year, we pause to honor two remarkable individuals whose dedication helped shape the spirit and success of our festival for decades.



Larry Pate

Larry Pate began volunteering with the Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival while working at WALA, serving alongside his wife, Jackie. What began as service soon became a lifelong commitment. Together, Larry and Jackie became a steady and trusted presence on the Festival Committee for decades. Over the years, they chaired the festival multiple times, guiding it through seasons of growth and change with experience and care.

Much of Larry's impact took place behind the scenes. His technical expertise and exceptional organizational skills strengthened countless aspects of the festival's operations, often in ways unseen but deeply felt. He especially enjoyed helping with the school art setup and treasured the friendships formed through years of service. Those relationships meant a great deal to him.

Larry led with steadiness and generosity. His dedication helped build the strong foundation on which the festival stands today. We remember him with gratitude and affection, knowing his legacy is woven into the fabric of this cherished community tradition.

Diane Rush Douglas

In 1989, after a twenty year career in education, Diane Rush Douglas opened In the Company of Angels in downtown Fairhope. She often shared that she was inspired to open the store after the loss of her mother. All she wanted to do, she said, was eat ice cream cones and open a shop filled with thoughtfulness. That is exactly what she created. For more than thirty five years, her beloved shop became a place defined by warmth, compassion, and intentional living.



Diane's spirit extended naturally beyond her storefront and into the Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival. She was instrumental

in the creation of the Adopt an Artist program, collaborating with downtown merchants to welcome participating artists with genuine Southern hospitality. She encouraged local business owners to become more involved in the festival and helped cultivate the welcoming culture for which Fairhope is known within the artist community. She had a rare and beautiful ability to bring people together.

In 1995, Diane wrote:

*"There must be Angels over Fairhope,
For it's such a special place,
Planters overflow with flowers,
And people welcome with such grace...
Surely Southern hospitality
Was born and bred right here,
So...
I'll tuck this Angel by my heart,
And keep that Fairhope spirit near."*

Today, Diane is our Angel Over Fairhope, forever. Her kindness, creativity, and deep love for this community will continue to inspire the festival for generations to come.

Celebrating 74 Years of the Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival

A Treasured Local Tradition

According to historical records and newspaper accounts, the Arts & Crafts Festival originally began as a tour planned to coordinate with the Mobile Jaycees' Azalea Trail and Mobile Mardi Gras celebrations. The idea was that visitors attending these major events in Mobile would be drawn across the bay, giving both visitors and local residents the opportunity to experience the many talents of Eastern Shore residents. The first Arts & Crafts Tour took place from February 22 to February 28, 1953. All exhibits were displayed inside store windows and represented a wide variety of artistic interests. The tour schedule included entertainment and craft demonstrations and lasted an entire week. Although some artists did sell items, the majority of the tour consisted of exhibits for viewing only.

In 1965, the tour expanded to include exhibitors and activities from the cities of Spanish Fort and Daphne. The week's opening ceremonies were held in Spanish Fort and concluded with a play in Fairhope. That year, the Chamber reported 4,150 visitors, with 52 exhibitors and demonstrators highlighted, in addition to another 41 participating artists. By 1967, the event featured more than one hundred displays, exhibits, and demonstrations. Although there was still no entry fee, all participants were asked to pay a 10 percent commission on their gross sales.

By 1975, craftsmen displayed their work and techniques in "Craft-Houses," which were vacant buildings repurposed for the event. In 1978, the show was condensed to three days for the first time. This was also the first year that craftsmen displayed their work on sidewalks rather than inside buildings and businesses. In 1983, prize money was awarded for the first time, with the Best of Show recipient receiving \$250, and booths were moved from the edges of the streets to the center. The Mary McGrath Award was established in 1984, and the first Spring Fever Chase was organized in 1986.



In many ways, the Festival truly took off in the 1990s, despite torrential rains in 1991 that damaged tents on opening day. This decade brought many firsts: the first expansion of the show to Magnolia, the introduction of a Food Court, the first television coverage, the first exchange of awards between the Chamber and the Art Center, the first year with more than 700 applicants, and the first time the Festival was named one of the Top 200 Festivals in the United States by Sunshine Artist magazine. Since then, the Festival has received this honor every year, based on votes from artists who participate in shows across the country.

As the Festival moved into the new millennium, its success continued, drawing hundreds of thousands of visitors and artists from across the United States. In 2016, the Fairhope Arts and Crafts Foundation was established to continue the tradition and expand the Festival's mission of community outreach. Since its inception, the Foundation has given back more than \$320,000, and sponsored city beautification and art projects like the staining of Arts Alley and the installation of Hannah Legg's "Paint the Town" mural next to the city's Welcome Center". This beloved local tradition, which consistently ranks among the top art shows in the country, will celebrate its 74th anniversary in 2026.

As this history shows, the Festival has evolved in many ways. Exhibitors are no longer limited to local artists but now come from across the United States. The Festival no longer charges exhibitors a commission on sales, relying instead on an entry fee. Attendance has grown to six-digit figures, and the activities surrounding the Festival have expanded significantly. Yet the Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival's purpose remains unchanged: to promote goodwill and festivity in Fairhope, to showcase the highest quality artwork and craftsmanship, and to host the Festival in one of the loveliest places in the world.



2026 Featured Artist, Natalie Catar

This year, the Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival is unveiling something distinctly new and timeless: its first-ever featured artwork rendered entirely in black and white. Titled *The Heron*, the 2026 featured artwork reflects the festival's theme, *Classic Fairhope: A Study in Black and White*, and offers a refined interpretation of the natural beauty and quiet elegance that define the Eastern Shore.

Created by artist Natalie H. Catar, *The Heron* captures one of Fairhope's most iconic coastal symbols through a minimalist lens, honoring both tradition and artistic restraint. The black-and-white composition marks a departure from previous years and underscores the festival's continued evolution while remaining rooted in its classic identity.

Festival Chairman Shannon Gandy shared her excitement about the significance of this year's featured artwork.

"This year's featured artwork represents a meaningful moment for our festival," Gandy said. "For the first time, we are highlighting a black-and-white piece that truly embodies the timeless character of Fairhope. *The Heron* is elegant, classic, and deeply connected to our coastal environment. It sets the tone for a festival that honors our history while celebrating the enduring power of art in our community."

The original artwork will be displayed during



the festival at the official merchandise tent. Limited-edition prints of *The Heron* will be available for purchase, along with a curated selection of festival merchandise featuring the artwork, including posters, commemorative items, and apparel created exclusively for the 2026 Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival.

Get to know Natalie

Natalie Catar, a resident of Fairhope Alabama is a talented artist with a background in Fine Arts and experience in set artistry in theatre and the film industry.

Specializing in oils, acrylics, colored pencil and graphite her artwork has a unique attention to detail.

Growing up in Louisiana visiting the French Quarter on the weekends, she has a passion for music and captures the feelings and mood of her subjects. She prides herself on noticing and loves people.

Much of her inspiration comes from her travels- so many states across the US, and much of Europe including France, Italy, England, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Croatia, the

Netherlands, Slovenia, and Austria, scenes from these travels as well as the infinite detail of the simplest and tiniest things such as a four leaf clover.

Natalie's diversity of subject and style touches a wide spectrum of audiences; her work has been featured in galleries in New Orleans and Ruston Louisiana and Mobile, Montgomery, Orange Beach and now Fairhope Alabama.

Besides drawings and paintings on canvas, some of Natalie's works have been made into greeting cards because she cherishes the art of hand written note and the warmth it brings.

She is proud to be a Fairhope local and has all of her prints and cards made right here in Fairhope.

Festival Quick Facts

The annual Arts & Crafts Festival is held every third weekend in March on the picturesque streets of Downtown Fairhope, located on the Eastern Shore of Mobile Bay. For three days, downtown Fairhope transforms from its quaint, charming, old-fashioned streets into an outdoor art gallery, featuring paintings, jewelry, pottery, and other handcrafted treasures. Admission is free!

The Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival is a 100% volunteer-run event. The Fairhope Arts & Crafts Foundation uses the proceeds to support the arts in the community through donations and scholarships. In addition to being recognized by various tourism departments and magazines as one of the top events in the South, it is also celebrated across the United States as one of the top Fine Art Festivals.

Directions:

If you are traveling along Interstate 10, take exit 35 and head south on US Highway 98. Continue on US Highway 98 for approximately 10 miles. Upon entering Fairhope, turn right onto Fairhope Avenue and head west into downtown Fairhope. The Festival is located downtown in the central business district.

Hot Wheels of Daphne provides shuttle service during the weekend. Parking for the shuttle will be available at the Baldwin Square Parking lot (former Winn-Dixie) and Piggly Wiggly parking lot in the Plantation Point shopping center, located on the corner of Hwy. 98 and Fairhope Ave.

HANDICAP PARKING:

Handicap Parking will be available:

- On Bancroft in the parking lot behind the Fairhope Museum of History.

DOWNTOWN PARKING/TOWING:

Parking is limited in the downtown area and available on a first-come, first-served basis. Please pay attention to no parking signs during the Festival and do not block driveways.

The City and Festival Committee make every effort to avoid towing vehicles, but it may be necessary if a driveway or residence is blocked or if your vehicle inter-

feres with Festival activities. In the event that your car is towed during the Festival, please call Tony's Towing Services at 251-928-7324.

Fairhope's Adopt an Artist Program proves Southern Hospitality is alive and well

For over thirty years, the merchants of Downtown Fairhope have offered a unique service to artists participating in the Festival by pairing them with local businesses for the weekend.

It all began when a few merchants, whose stores were near Festival artists, offered a place to rest, snacks, and restroom access. This gesture was so well-received that the Downtown Fairhope Business Association formalized the concept, and the "Adopt an Artist" program was born.

For more than three decades, Diane Douglas, owner of In the Company of Angels, organized the program in partnership with the Downtown Fairhope Business Association. In 2023, the honor was passed on to sisters Barbara Miller Levitt and Carol Miller Eberlein, owners of M&F Casuals.

Merchants volunteer to provide services like general information, refreshments, restroom access, and, of course, Southern hospitality to Festival artists. While not all artists take advantage of the offer, those who do often highlight it as one of the Festival's "major highlights." Some artists have even suggested the program to other Festivals, inspiring similar initiatives nationwide. Many local merchants cherish their time with the artists and request to be paired with the same artist year after year, building lasting friendships with little effort or expense.

The Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival Foundation thanks all of our local business owners and their employees for their continued support and welcoming spirit, which make our Festival—and Downtown Fairhope—so special.



Adjacent Art Show Happening this Weekend

Did you know that two art shows take place simultaneously in Downtown Fairhope each year during the third weekend in March? The Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival, organized by the Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival Foundation, and the Annual Outdoor Art Show, hosted by the Eastern Shore Art Center, are held side by side.

Now in its 54th year, the Outdoor Art Show, hosted by the Eastern Shore Art Center, is located directly next to the Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival. Nearly 100 artist booths line Section Street, north of Magnolia Avenue, and Oak Street in front of the Art Center.

The ESAC Outdoor Art Show is a major fundraiser for the Art Center, helping to fund free public admission year-round. For more information on the ESAC Outdoor Art Show and artist listings, visit www.esartcenter.org.



2026 Festival Judges

The Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival; Judged and Juried

The Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival is a juried event. For those unfamiliar with the term, juried art events have a selection committee for exhibitors and require that applicants submit slides or photos of work or products and booth displays, along with other information like art process, material descriptions, and/or other relevant information for their prospective art mediums or category. The selection committee (the jury) reviews all applications before choosing exhibitors for the event. On average, the Fairhope Arts & Crafts Festival receives over 500 applicants, with the final show consisting of roughly 200 to 225 invited exhibitors.

On the first day of the Festival three judges evaluate the more than 200 participants in the show. They select winners by scoring each individual artist and the artists with the highest overall scores get the largest awards. There is also an award for each artist with the highest score for their medium. Being selected a winner is not just about the honor – it comes with a cash prize and a coveted spot in next year's Festival. Meet the 2026 judges...



Liz Lane

Liz Lane is an abstract expressionist that uses thoughts, emotions and the world surrounding her to create tangible visions of color and movement. Using acrylic and oil on canvas, her paintings are alchemy of an internal world trying to process the external.

Lane has balanced running a business in a changing world - from commercial galleries to now an open studio. She balances this with community driven environmental activism and being a mom. She and her husband currently live in Birmingham, Alabama.

Devontae Knight

Rooted in memories of the Deep South, Devontae Knight's work begins with the belief that beauty often emerges from unlikely or overlooked places—sometimes as the only light within adversity. This perspective drives his focus on honoring what modern society tends to discard: creativity, originality, and the subtle craftsmanship found in the ordinary.

Devontae explores these themes by positioning subjects against expansive, uncluttered backgrounds, creating intentional contrasts that reflect both artistic tradition and personal identity. Over time, he has developed a signature impasto style using oils and a palette knife, paired with handcrafted frames incorporating materials such as eggshell, fabric, mirrors, and mosaics — techniques passed down from his mentor, Nall Hollis. The process is raw, tactile, and intuitive, embracing imperfection as a source of depth and resonance.

“Through these works, I seek to evoke the emotions that linger just beneath the surface—reminders of the beauty, resilience, and individuality that persist despite a world increasingly drawn to uniformity.”



Jayne Morgan



Jayne Morgan travels across the country in her Airstream trailer showcasing her oil and acrylic paintings. Her 1964 Airstream is regularly the subject of her work, as well as landscapes, flowers in jars, and her signature subject - the Honeybear. Growing up Jayne's family would sit down to dinner and always had a bear shaped honey bottle to put on bread for dessert. After graduating from SCAD, she knew she wanted to do art festivals but didn't have much direction. An artist she admired told her she should be 'the Honeybear lady', people would remember that. Then she had an assignment. Jayne started painting honeybear after honeybear and people did remember. Her hometown of Hoover, Alabama used the Honeybear for their anti-littering campaign and over 20 Honeybear signs were placed around the town.

When Jayne is not traveling, she is teaching art classes in her studio in Bluff Park, Alabama and volunteering for people with special needs. Recently she has gotten into film and television, working on movie sets, a music video and commercials. Some of her clients include Harry Styles, Jeff Goldblum, and Kurt Russel. *A Tradition of Creativity

The Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival Student Art Competition has been a cherished tradition since 2007, inviting Eastern Shore middle and high school students to create artwork inspired by the festival's annual theme. In its early years, schools participated by submitting a single collaborative mural, which was displayed at the Artist Awards Dinner on Friday night. Festival artists voted for their favorite piece, with cash prizes awarded to support the winning schools' art programs.

A New Chapter for Student Artists

In 2025, the Festival Foundation introduced a new format, opening the competition to individual students and small groups. This shift marked a significant evolution in the program and proved to be a tremendous success, with an impressive number of submissions showcasing the depth of talent and creativity among young artists across Baldwin County.

Building on that momentum, the Festival is excited to welcome student submissions for the 2026 competition. Students are invited to submit artwork inspired by this year's theme, *Classic Fairhope: A Study in Black and White*. All artwork is created on canvases provided by the Festival.

Judging, Awards, and Exhibition

The top 30 submissions will be selected for display at the Art-ist Awards Dinner on Friday, March 20, where participating Festival artists will judge and vote on their favorite pieces during the event's cocktail hour. Cash prizes will be awarded to the top three winners, with the winners announced that evening. Following the awards, the top 10 will be on display during the festival on Saturday and Sunday in the downtown windows of CK Collection and Fantasy Island Toys. After the Festival, the winning artwork will be displayed at Fairhope Chocolate and will remain on display until the following year's Festival.

Highlights from the 2025 Competition

Last year's Student Art Competition celebrated the 2025 festival theme, *Fairhope in Bloom*. For the first time, Baldwin County middle and high school students participated individually, creating original works inspired by the theme *Paint the Town*. The response was overwhelming, with more than 40 submissions from talented young artists across the community. Selected works were displayed during the Fairhope Arts and Crafts Festival Artist Awards Dinner and judged by participating festival artists.
